Being able to ask questions and talk situations through, will better help you understand the information and for you to be able to make an informed decision on how to best implement your support in the way that's right for you.



With a masters degree in psychology and a background in the care sector, Lauren brings invaluable knowledge in this area, and helps us develop our ideas to make sure they work for people. She is also our job advert person and posts and updates all the PA job vacancies on behalf of PA employers. She can also be found facilitating our peer support group online sessions.

Clackmannan & Stirling Health and Social Care Partnership Carer Consultation

Clackmannanshire & Stirling Health and Social Care Partnership currently have a live Carer Consultation ongoing until 1st August 2023.

This consultation is the wider consultation of the 'Carer Support Framework' which replaces the carers eligibility criteria has now been published on the HSCP website.

The framework proposes the removal of thresholds of eligibility for support, widening the support available for carers. Where a carer requires support, this would be provided by the local carers centres however where care is required then they would access social work as a supported person and existing eligibility would apply.

This provides an excellent opportunity for you to have your voice heard, so please take part and express your views.
